The 13th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, and many state constitutions, includes an exception clause that allows slavery, involuntary servitude, to be used as a punishment for crime. People who are incarcerated, disproportionately people of color, are legally forced to work for little to no pay (\$0.63/hr = national average), often under hazardous conditions and the threat of additional punitive measures if they refuse.
